Perinatal Pelvic Health Webinar - NHS England Long Term Plan

(Barriers to healthcare & discrepancies with Scotland/Wales/Northern Ireland)

A multidisciplinary webinar organised by The MASIC Foundation with leading speakers, reflecting the diverse professional roles required to co-ordinate and deliver effective evidence based and individualised care for women who have experienced Obstetric Anal Sphincter Injuries (OASI), pelvic floor injuries and their consequences.

In June 2021, NHS England announced that tens of thousands of pregnant women and new mums would benefit from their perinatal pelvic health initiative (PPHI). This was to be in the form of new one stop shop clinics for women with symptoms, bringing together midwives, specialist doctors and specialist physiotherapists under one roof. The clinics were to be initially rolled out in 14 areas of the country with up to 175,000 women set to benefit from the additional support every year. The MASIC Foundation looks at these services two years on. Is the NHS providing the services they promised, what do they look like in reality and have women seen a marked attitude change in being referred to the clinics?
